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

There are considerable constraints associated with vast distances, harsh remote environments, limited human and financial availability, and the constant deterioration of community assets.

- Inaccessible without a 4WD & during weather events (rain & high temperatures)
- Very high contractor expenses associated with travel constraints



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Investment & Evaluation



In 2014, the The Indigenous Advancement Strategy (IAS) replaced more than 150 individual programmes and activities with five flexible, broad-based programmes

Enter – Healthy Community Assessment Tool (HCAT)




Its a tool to measure, monitor and evaluate key social determinants of health at a community level in Australian rural and remote communities.






Health Hardware - Plumbing

Report on the public health issues in accordance with:

- Public and Environmental Health Act & Regulations
- Code of Practice for Small On-Site Sewage and Sullage Treatment Systems and the Disposal or Reuse of Sewage Effluent (the Code)
- Audit Findings (Urapuntja & Plumbing Agency)



Disseminate report to all key stakeholders within Urapuntja Aboriginal Corporation (UAC) and Barkly Regional Council (BRC)



Monitor – ongoing fix & make safe program for all houses with no connection to water or sewage treatment (Managed by Urapuntja Aboriginal Corporation)



Establish commitment by BRC and UAC through commitment to a working group (Facilitated by Environmental Health)



Identify & obtain financial sources to address all plumbing issues across the entirety of the Utopia Homelands



Monitor 'application process' to alter or install septic systems for all ongoing works
